You could also see if you can estimate how many cupful's of water it takes to fill up a bottle or other containers around your home.
- Go on an 'alphabet treasure hunt' and look for things that begin with each letter (s for sink). You could take some photographs of your findings and send them to our reception email address.
- Design and make your own pirate hat -
